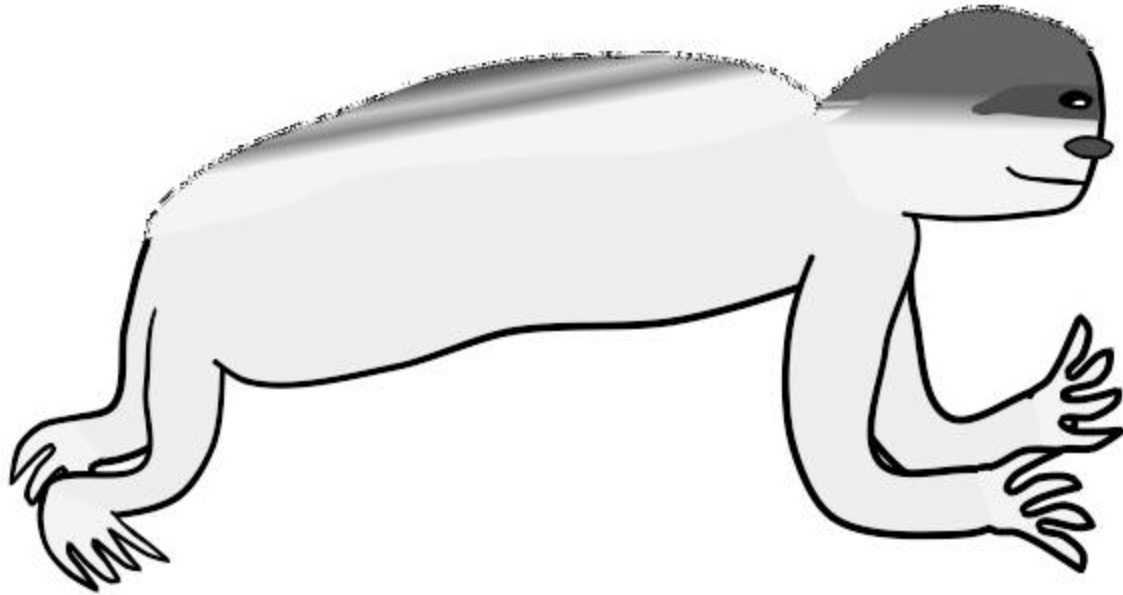


# Sandy the Sloth

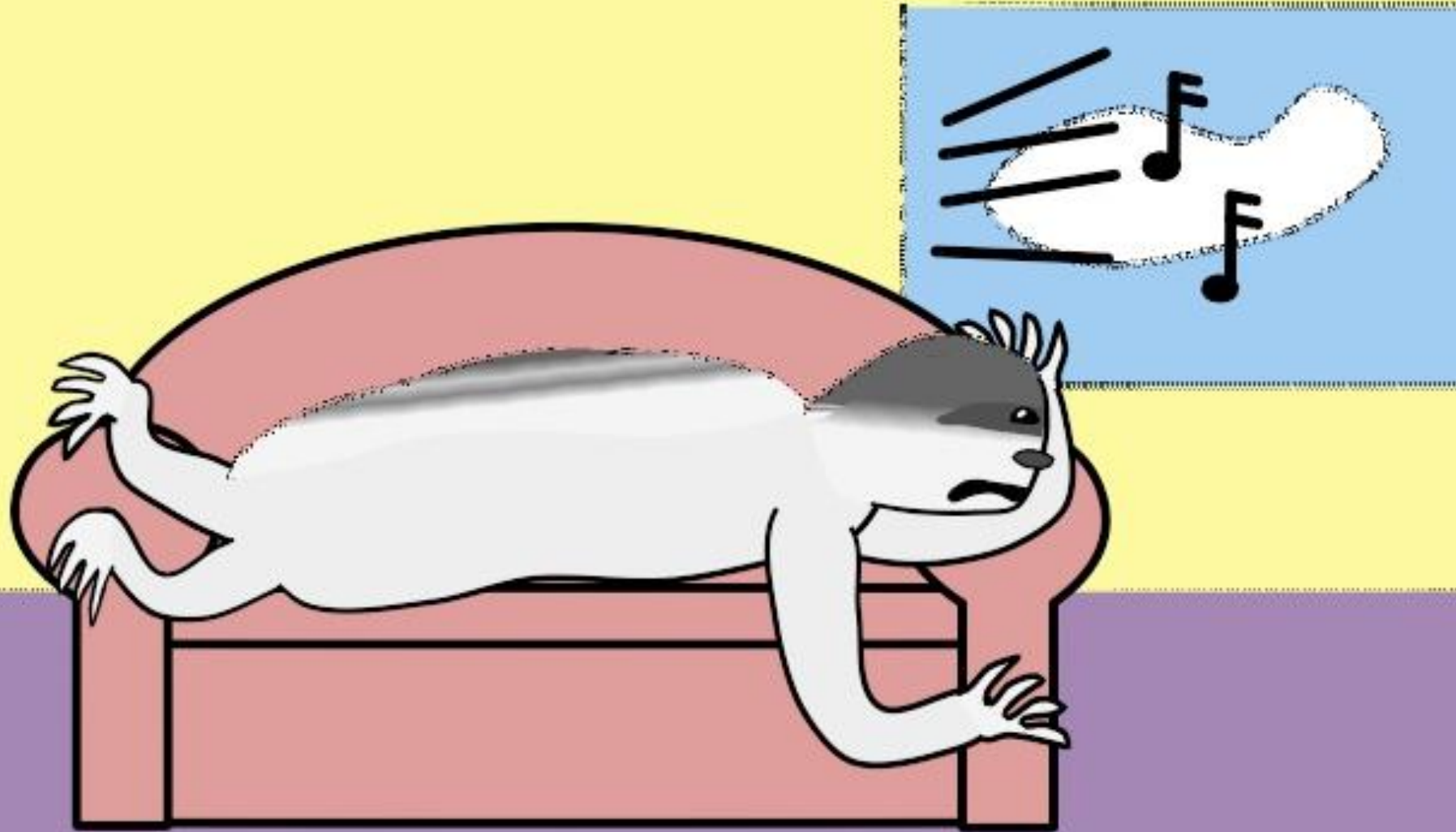
Sandy the Sloth loved to sleep on his sofa.

As soon as Catlin got to Sandy's house, she could see a party happening next door.

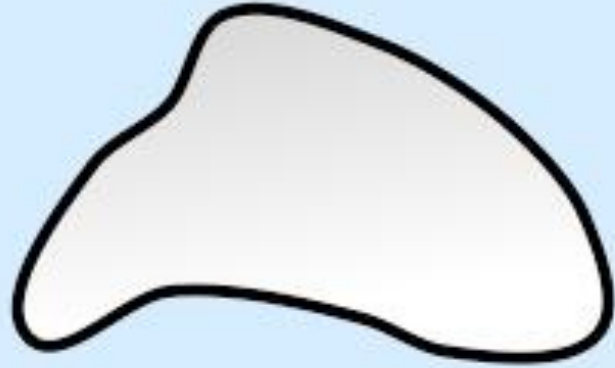


It was certainly a feast that Catlin adored, eating all the noisy rats that kept Sandy awake.
